
When Doug feels sad, he sometimes cries and his mouth curls down at the sides. His eyes look down.





When Doug feels worried, nervous or frightened, he gets all shaky and his eyebrows go lower on his face. His tummy sometimes feels sore.






Doug knows that feelings come and go. They are a normal part of life.


He can work out how to help himself feel happier.
